Originally performed at the National Theatre in London in November of 1978, Betrayal was Harold Pinter's seventh full-length play and marked a change in his writing style, moving from more "absurd" or "violent" themes to a much more conventional play. This semi autobiographical piece was inspired by his seven year affair with TV presenter Joan Bakewell (wife of producer/director Michael Bakewell) while he himself was married to actress Vivian Merchant.

Told in a unique mostly reverse chronological order, this format was considered innovative for the time as you follow this 10 year span in the lives of our three main characters.

Thank you for joining and supporting us on this journey. I have been happy to work with this cast and production crew through this process as they strove to bring a bring a realistically human perspective to this work in which the script is often (in my opinion) cold and mechanical.



















Next Onstage...

Providing the inspiration for the TV series "Columbo", the theatrical predecessor *Prescription: Murder* tells the story of a brilliant psychiatrist and his mistress who hatch a plot to murder his neurotic, possessive wife. The execution of their plan and the creation of their perfect alibi depends on a bizarre impersonation. Lt. Columbo must engage the psychiatrist in a duel of wits until the doctor succeeds in having Columbo removed from the case. However, it is the mistress who proves to be the weak link that leads to a trap and a surprising climax!
